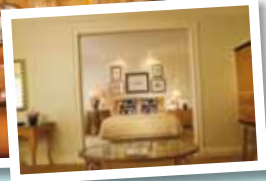
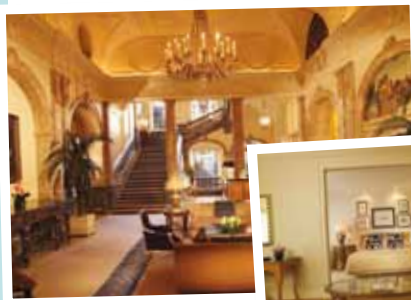
Home from home
